A field of three hundred and fourteen cyclists from all over Australia will tackle this Saturdays McDonalds Grafton to Inverell Cycle Classic. Riders from every state in Australia along with a few international riders from New Zealand and the US have entered for the 51st edition of Australia's premier one day race.

Sixty four riders from the northern NSW region spanning from the QLD border south to Port Macquarie and west to Moree will be on the start line in Grafton. Host club Inverell Cycle N Tri will have thirteen riders spread across all three grades in the 228km race with two to start in A grade, two in B grade with the others contesting the C grade section. Other North West clubs to be represented are Tamworth with 3 riders, Armidale 2 riders and Moree and Gunnedah having one rider each in the great race.
